

Andrew Colley

Andrew has over 20 years of operational, development and management experience within the wholesale trading and settlements arrangements including involvement in the majority of major stages of GB electricity market liberalisation and reform, including :-

- Development of privatisation vesting, Final Metering Scheme and 1994 expansion of supply competition arrangements;
- adaptation and operation of SSE's Back Office Trading agreements, systems and processes to accommodate 1998 expansion of supply competition, followed by agency competition then the development of NETA processes;
- management and implementation of the BETTA arrangements for SSE's Generation and Supply businesses, covering all obligations arising under the GB BSC, CUISC, Grid Code as well as the orderly run down of Scottish Electricity Settlements.

He is currently serving as an industry elected member of the BSC Panel, having been elected in 2010, and having previously served as an Alternate for 4 years prior to this. He currently acts as the Panel Sponsor for PAB and is also a member of the Credit Committee.

Additionally, Andrew has participated in numerous modifications and issues groups since the introduction of NETA, as well as previously having served as a member of the ISG, TDC and Q8 Committees for many years.

His wider recent roles and responsibilities have been varied providing a broad range of experience, ranging from project management of SSE's entry into various new market opportunities, including N2EX, EastWest Interconnector and North Sea E&P, to commercial contract management activities, to development and assessment of demand side response opportunities, to review of and participation in on-going European and GB energy policy developments such as EMR, to on-going provision of expertise, advice, guidance and direction with regard to the GB Trading Arrangements.

Barbara Vest

Barbara has been employed within the supply sector of the industry since 1991, initially with the Supply Businesses of Northern Electric, Yorkshire Electricity and Gaz de France ESS. In March 2008 Barbara began working as Head of Electricity Trading for the Association of Electricity Producers. The Association recently merged with the Energy Retail Association and UK Business Council for Sustainable Energy to create Energy UK. Barbara was appointed Director of Generation in June 2012.

Barbara has been a Director of ELEXON, an Industry Member of the BSC Panel and Panel Sponsor of the Imbalance Settlement Group (ISG) since 2000.

Barbara was a member of the Pool Executive Committee and several sub committees under the Electricity Pool. In addition she also served on the Scottish Modifications Panel, NGC's Transmission User Group and the Gas Network Code Panel. During the early stages of the development of the New Electricity Trading Arrangements (NETA) Barbara was involved with the Development and Implementation Steering Group and the Security of Supply Expert Group.

Since starting her work at the AEP, Barbara has been appointed as Chair of National Grid's Joint European Standing Group and as a member of the Grid Code Review Panel. She is also

the elected Chair of the APX ENDEX UK Member Product Board. Barbara has recently retired from the Connection Use of System Panel and the Distribution Code Review Panel.

Bob Brown

An electrical engineer by profession, Bob has over 40 years' experience in the electricity industry in a wide variety of business roles, mainly in supply and customer related activities, including Head of Settlements and Head of Trading Development at a large energy supplier. For the past ten years he has been an associate of Cornwall Energy, a leading independent consultant and provider of market intelligence on the UK energy sector.

Bob's experience has been put to good use in practical ways as an active member of many development groups charged with considering and delivering changes to market rules, including both the BSC and Transmission areas. As part of the run up to NETA, Bob was a member of the NETA Implementation Advisory Board.

Bob is an elected industry member of the CUSC Modifications Panel and an appointed member of two BSC Panel sub-committees, the ISG and SVG.

Peter Bolitho

Peter is the Trading Arrangements Manager for E.ON UK and manages a team dealing with grid connections and changes to gas and electricity market rules and charging arrangements. He joined the energy industry in 1991 after a number of commercial roles in manufacturing. After 6 years with British Gas where he negotiated and developed third party access contracts in the newly liberalised gas market, he joined his current employer (then known as Powergen). Here he initially managed changes to the gas Network Code before taking up his current role in 2001.

Since NETA Go-live Peter has been actively involved with changes to the BSC. He has served on a number of BSC committees and modification groups including Imbalance Settlement Group, Pricing Standing Modification Group, Governance Standing Modification Group, Transmission Loss Factor Modification Group and the Notification Error Modification Group. Between 2004 and 2005 he served on Ofgem's Development and Implementation Steering Group overseeing the sale of gas distribution networks. More recently he participated in Ofgem's Code Governance Review (2008-10) including the work of the Code Administrators Working Group

Stuart Cotten

Stuart has over twelve years' experience in the energy industry and has been involved with BSC matters throughout this time. He started his career in a trading support function, before moving into gas and electricity contract management and then into energy market regulation and policy.

Working within the Regulation and Policy team at Drax Power Limited, Stuart is primarily responsible for GB wholesale electricity market arrangements and their development. Over the last five years, Stuart has been an active participant in government, regulator and industry-led work-streams. This has involved participation in a number of expert groups, including DECC's Grid Access Reform Advisory Group (2009/10), Ofgem's Project Transmit Technical Advisory Group (2011) and DECC's EMR Capacity Mechanism Expert Group (2012).

Since joining the BSC Panel in 2010, Stuart has been a member of the Credit Committee and has acted as Panel Sponsor to the Trading Disputes Committee. Stuart is also currently a member of the CUSC Governance Standing Group (GSG) and is chairman of Energy UK's Electricity Trading Committee.
