

<b>Change Proposal – BSCP40/02</b>	<b>CP No: 1428</b> <i>Version No: 1.0</i> <i>(mandatory by BSCCo)</i>
<b>Title</b> (mandatory by originator) Inclusion of Party Agents in the event of Post Final Settlement Runs	
<b>Description of Problem/Issue</b> (mandatory by originator) <p>If a Trading Dispute is upheld, the Trading Dispute Committee (TDC) authorises corrective action to be taken to correct the Settlement Error. Some corrective actions cover a Post Final Settlement Run (PFSR). To enter the corrected values into the Settlement process, the Supplier must inform their Agents of the corrective action as mentioned within BSCP11 and captured on the BSCP11/07 Findings form. The Supplier informs their Data Collector (DC) to perform the corrective action. An ambiguity has been identified when the DC and Data Aggregator (DA) responsibilities are administered by different companies. The Supplier informs their DC but inadvertently forget about the DA. The DA then receives a request from the DC to perform PFSR for a given period and questions or reject it because they have ceased performing PFSR.</p>	
<b>Proposed Solution</b> (mandatory by originator) <p>We propose to amend the existing step within BSCP11 section 5.4 to provide clarity to the Supplier to inform all their relevant DCs and DAs (remove Agents) to perform corrective action for PFSR when instructed by the TDC as a result of an upheld Trading Dispute.</p>	
<b>Justification for Change</b> (mandatory by originator) <p>A change is required to BSCP11 to mandate the Supplier to inform both the DC and DA (remove Agents) when the TDC authorises a corrective action in PFSR from a Trading Dispute. This change will improve the existing process and ensure that it is clear who the Supplier will need to inform. This will reduce the risk that corrective action is not entered into Settlement.</p>
