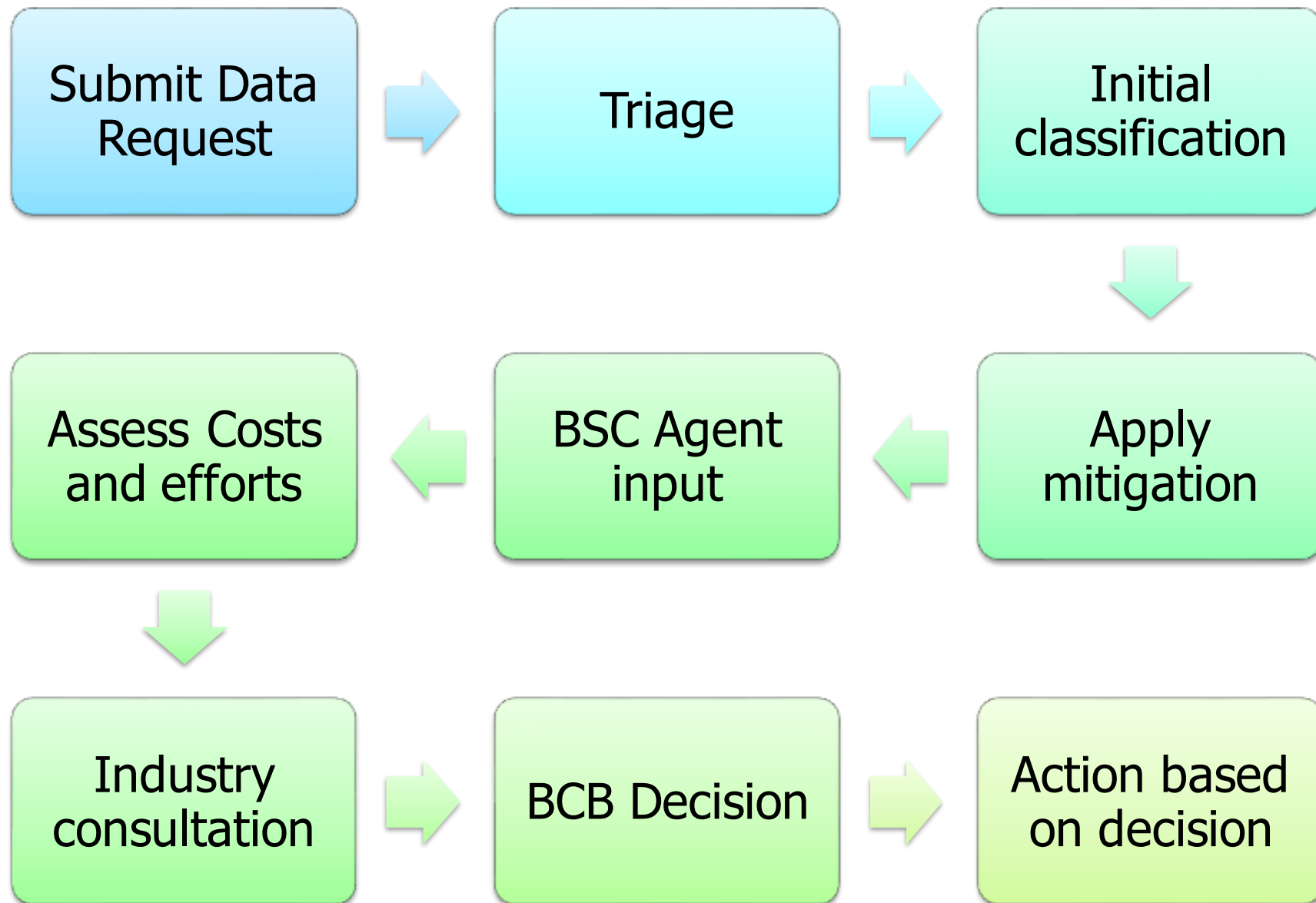

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## P398 solution

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- Templates will be provided
- Instructions for completing forms to be published
- Processes will be published
- Everything should be easily discoverable
- Applications to be published (subject to triage and classification)
- Appeals process, but Panel's decision will be final
- Statistics to be published and/or shared
- BMRS Change Board Terms of Reference to align with other sub-committees as close as possible
- Standing delegations

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# Triaging data

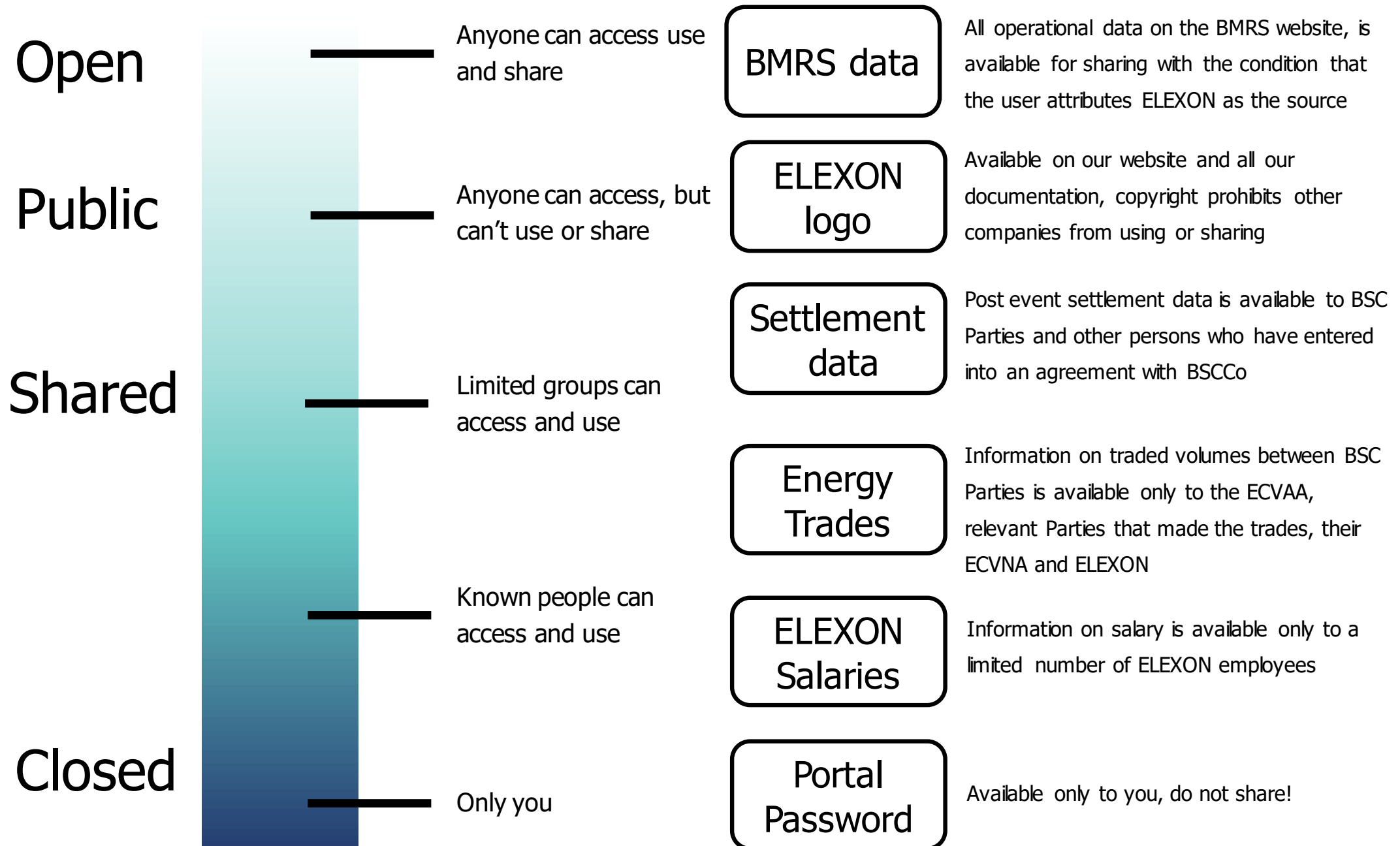
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All data should be triaged against each of these categories i.e. a simple yes/no:

- Consumer privacy – are there consumer Privacy issues either directly or indirectly?
  - Can the data be used to identify a private person? e.g. address
  - Can the data be used alongside other data to identify an individual? e.g. MSID (MPAN)
- Consumer Impact – will releasing the data have a negative impact on consumers?
  - What does negative impact mean?
  - To what extent will there be a negative impact?
- Security – will releasing the data have security implications?
- Commercial – are there commercial implications for releasing the data?
- Governance – does the law/BSC allow for sharing of the dataset?



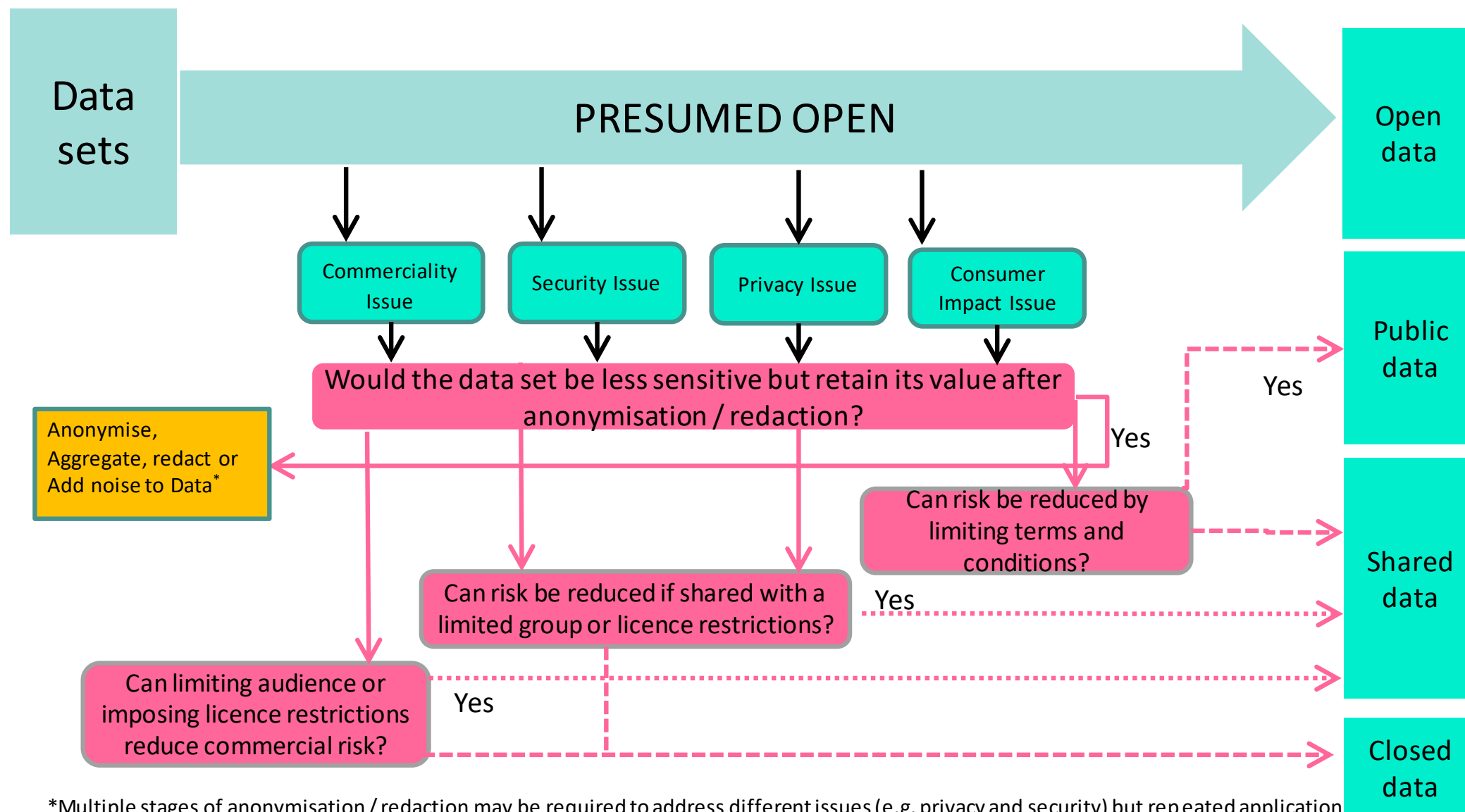
# Scale of how open the access to data is



# Possible mitigation techniques (not conclusive)

Redaction	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Removal of sensitive data</li></ul>
Anonymisation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Removal of personal data</li></ul>
Aggregation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Combine data sets so the collective sum is less sensitive</li></ul>
Limitation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Only share with specific individuals or group(s)</li></ul>
Noise	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Combine original data with meaningless data to confuse</li></ul>
Delay	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Wait until data is less sensitive before sharing</li></ul>
Differential Privacy	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Obscuring the data in such a way as to mask original identities</li></ul>
Shift/rotate	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Altering the position or orientation of spatial or time series data</li></ul>
Randomisation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Making random changes to data</li></ul>
Normalisation	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Modifying data to reduce the difference between individual subjects</li></ul>

# Classification of data



\*Multiple stages of anonymisation / redaction may be required to address different issues (e.g. privacy and security) but repeated application should be limited

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## What we've done since we last met

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- Business Requirements
- Process design
- Drafting of legal text
- Attended Energy Data Best practice workshop
- Ensured that all input from Workgroup has been built into the solution and/or implementation plan

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## Meeting group one actions (1 of 2)

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- Avoid duplicating data available elsewhere – BRs have requirement to consider other industry data as part of our internal processes
- Data labelling to be considered i.e. which bit of BSC requires it's creation – we will add this to our internal processes
- Consider ACER's REMIT guidance – we have reviewed and are happy that we are proposing best practice
- There should be a central body for coordinating data – Ofgem are working on this and it is outside of P398
- Codify Cost-Benefit-Analysis – this is in the BRs and will be codified
- ELEXON to engage BSC Agents – we are liaising with colleagues that manage contracts about best way ahead
- Make decision making process public to allow synergy between BSCCo, BCB and requester – see Business requirements
- Consultation process to be by negative response – this will be built into the template

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## Meeting group one actions (2 of 2)

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- ELEXON to draft consultation template – see Business requirements
- When assessing risk, need to consider opening up markets and innovation etc. against the competition implications for looking at identified patterns – see Business requirements
- Number of appeals to be limited to one – the Panel will arbitrate definitively
- ELEXON to develop draft request form and process to triage the request form – see Business Requirements
- The BCB will have the ability to direct the BSCCo – included in Business Requirements
- ELEXON to report data request statistics to Ofgem – included in Business Requirements
- ELEXON to confirm how to treat third party data – completed
- ELEXON to produce examples of mitigation e.g. noise – will include in consultation
- Discuss methods of sharing data with InfoSec – ongoing

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## P398 – Impacts to Existing Code Sections

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- Data that the BSC explicitly identifies as being confidential:
  - See overleaf for list
  - Key decision for P398 Workgroup is whether BSC Trading Data should be subject to open data process i.e. confidential reports under Section V
- Should existing processes for publishing BSC data be aligned with P398 e.g. Panel powers under B3.3
- Existing IPR provisions in Section H allow BSC data to be used only for the purposes contemplated by the Code. Should this be relaxed to allow Parties and non-parties to use for wider purposes?

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## BSC Provisions that establish confidential information

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- Annex C-1 – information that relates to non-BSC activities that may be undertaken by BSCCo
- Section E – confidential information in BSC Agent and BSC Service Manager contracts
- Section F – confidential representations made in response to mod. Consultations
- Section H – certain information contained in reports provided by sandbox participants
- Section N - Ledger accounts maintained by the FAA
- Section T - data relating to a Party used in connection with Market Index Data
- Section V – Trading Data
- Section W – items identified as confidential in TDC terms of reference
- Section Z – PAB minutes, papers, certain information held by PAA

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# Identification and Prevention of Gaming - Principles

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- Open Data should not give one Party commercial advantages over another
  - Parties should be free to gain commercial advantage from how they use the data, but not have privileged access to data
- Need to try to ensure data can not be combined with other Open Data sets to breach commercial confidentiality

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# Identification and Prevention of Gaming - Roles

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- It is not within BSCCo's remit to monitor the market
  - Ofgem Monitor and Regulate
- Any Party that believes any Open Data is leading to Gaming should report their concerns to Ofgem
- BSCCo would report concerns to Ofgem, but does not have the resource to police the use of data

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# Identification and Prevention of Gaming - Questions

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- What can we do to identify and prevent gaming?
  
- Should there be a process to flag concerns to BSCCo?
  - Should there be a process to suspend publication of data if gaming is suspected?
  - How would such a process work?
  - How much analysis should BSCCo do?
  - How much analysis by BSCCo are Parties prepared to pay for?
  
- What are the Work Group's views on Gaming?
  - Is it a concern?
  - What should be done about it?
